The first attempt to produce a list of cruck buildings was made by J T Smith in 1958, as the basis for the first proper distribution map of the technique. This list was not published, but formed the starting point for a list made by R F Taylor, which in its turn was the basis for the compilation of the Catalogue of cruck buildings (Alcock 1973).

At the apex, however, a variety of methods were used to secure the blades, and N. W. Alcock in his book A Catalogue of Cruck Buildings gives distribution maps of the six main methods. The most common forms are not jointed at the apex but held together either by a yoke situated at the top on which the ridge-beam sits or, somewhat lower, by a collar with the blades butting against the ridge-beam.

A cruck or crook frame is a curved timber, one of a pair, which supports the roof of a building, used particularly in England.This type of timber framing consists of long, generally naturally curved, timber members that lean inwards and form the ridge of the roof. These posts are then generally secured by a horizontal beam which then forms an "A" shape
