When we think about the components of human language, we think of it as consisting of the following: A sound-system (or phonological component). A set of vocabulary items (the "lexicon"). A grammatical system ("morphology") which puts meaningful elements together into 'words'.

Structure of Language

A lexicon, word-hoard, wordbook, or word-stock is the vocabulary of a person, language, or branch of knowledge. In linguistics, a lexicon is a language's inventory of lexemes. The word lexicon derives from the Greek λεξικόν, neuter of λεξικός meaning 'of or for words'. Linguistic theories generally regard human languages as consisting of two parts: a lexicon, essentially a catalogue of a language's words; and a grammar, a system of rules which allow for the combination of those ...

Previous studies (9, 19 –21, 23, 24, 42 –45) have investigated the presence or absence of universality in how languages structure the lexicon in a few semantic domains dealing with personal items like body parts, perceptual elements like color metaphors, and cultural items like kinship relations. In this work, we study instead the domain of celestial and landscape objects that one may a priori expect to be strongly affected by the environment.
